

- The chapter is clearly written. It is organized in a slightly different way than the previous two chapters. It does not include images and reads at a different level. If instructors wanted to cover attachment in more detail, it would provide a good supplement to a textbook more commonly used in a child development course because it covers some areas that are not typically covered. For example, it reviews attachment into adulthood. This might be a better fit for a lifespan development course.
- It does not include a text bank. It is a single chapter on attachment across the lifespan.
